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Statutory Overview

- Police and Fire Reform (Scotland) Act 2012
- Must be prepared for every local authority area
- SFRS may at any time review/revise the plan:
- By order of Scottish Ministers
- New Strategic Plan is approved
- If not revised during three year period following publication



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Local Fire & Rescue Plan

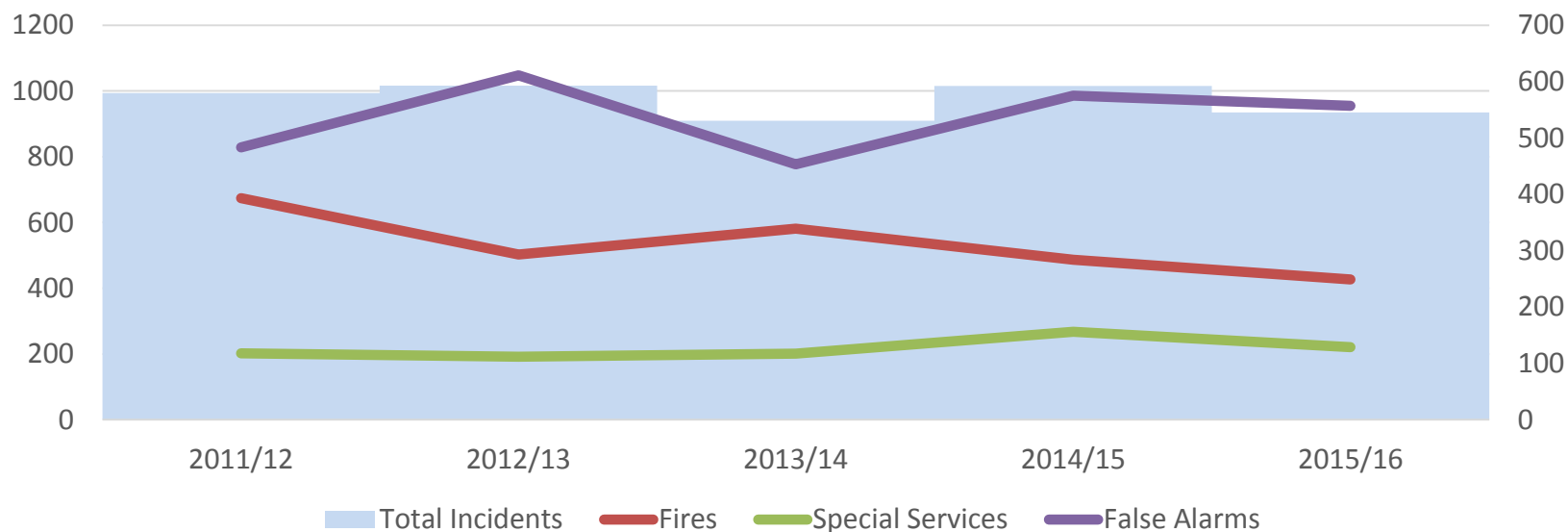
- Priorities and objectives for SFRS to carry out duties & functions
- Reasons for selecting those priorities and objectives
- How SFRS propose to deliver those priorities and objectives
- How they can be measured (as far as is reasonably practicable)
- How those priorities and objectives are expected to contribute to the delivery of any other relevant local outcomes which are identified by community planning



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Moray Operational Activity



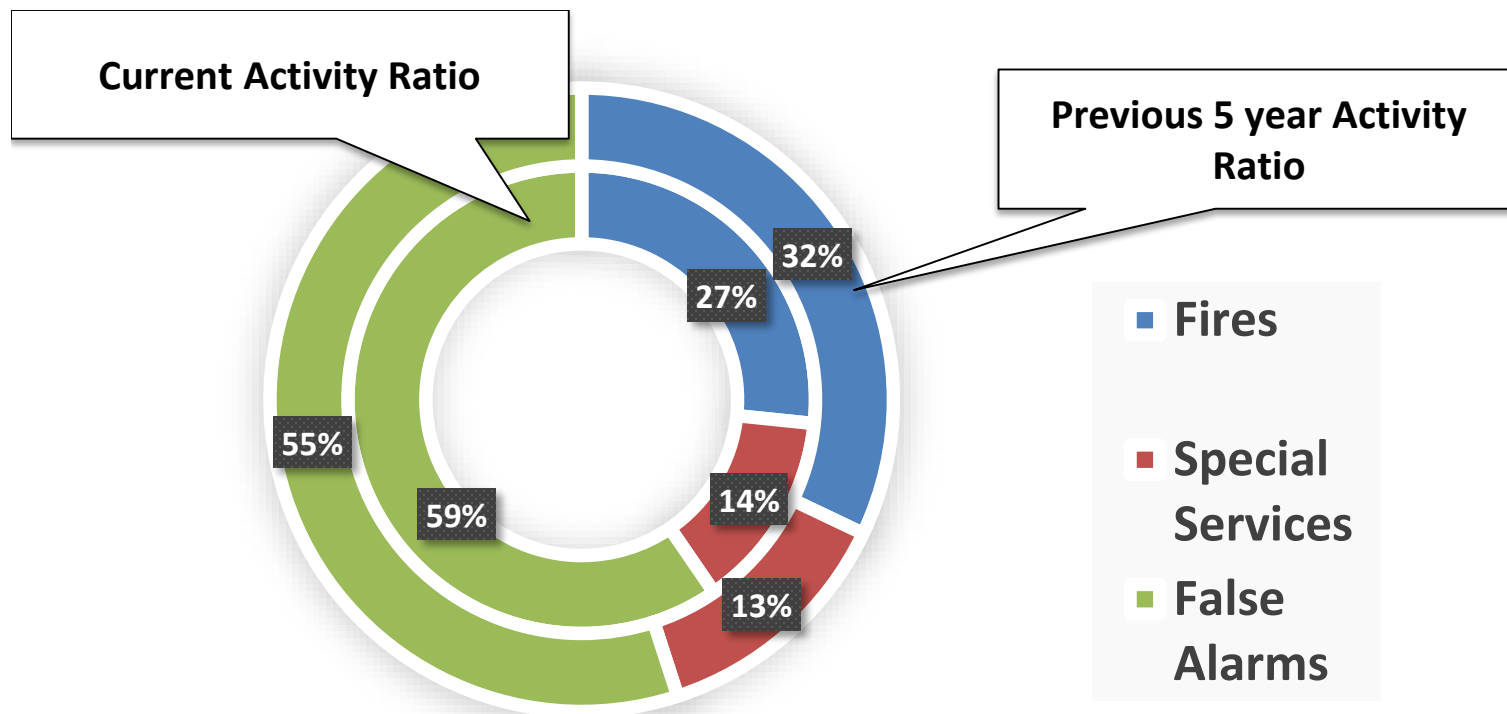

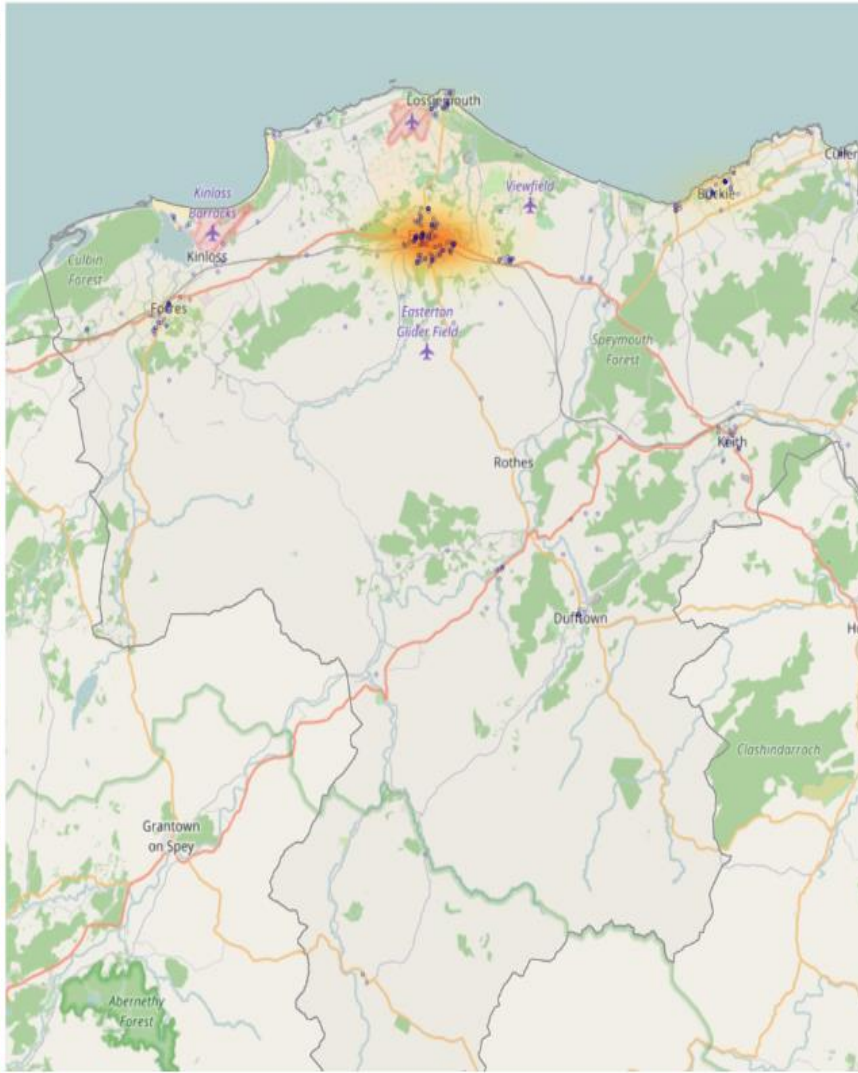

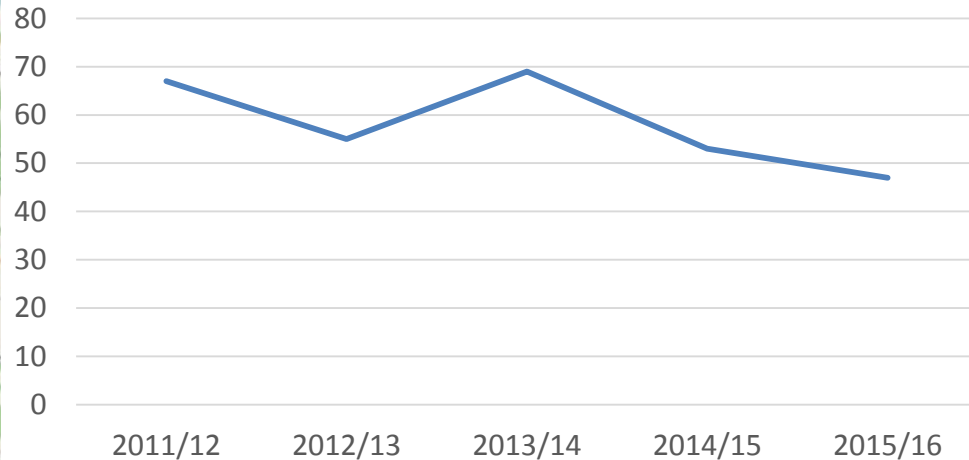
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Accidental Dwelling Fires Density Map for Moray

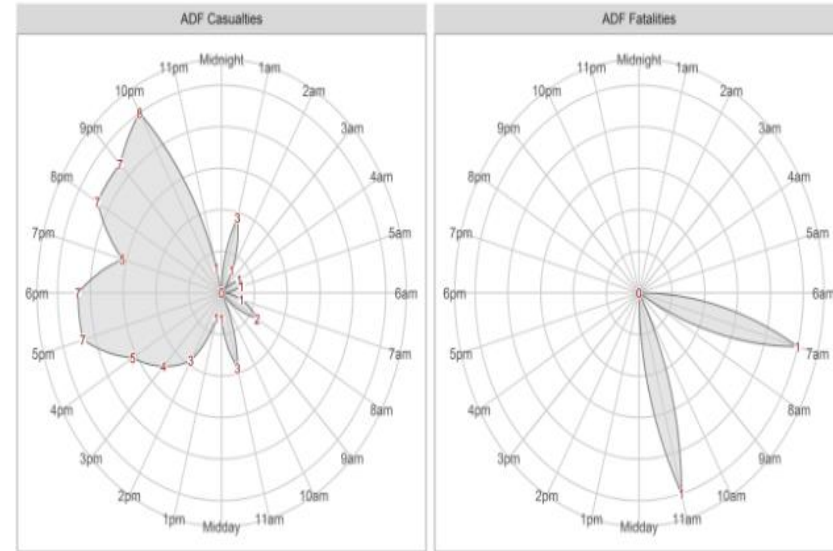
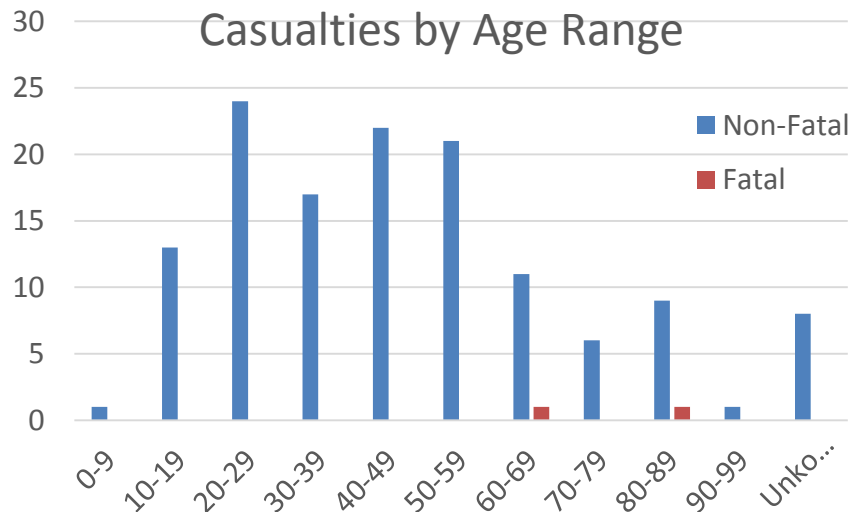
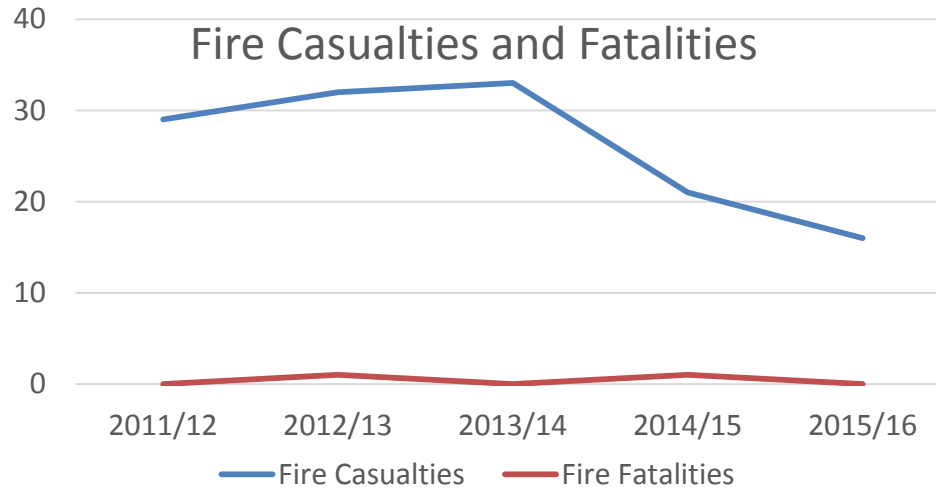
- Most Common Cause – Cooking (48%)
- Automatic Detection Present (66%)
- Alarm Raised (71%)
- No Firefighting Action Required by SFRS other than removing the item from the heat source (63%)



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Priority - Reduction in fire Casualties and Fatalities



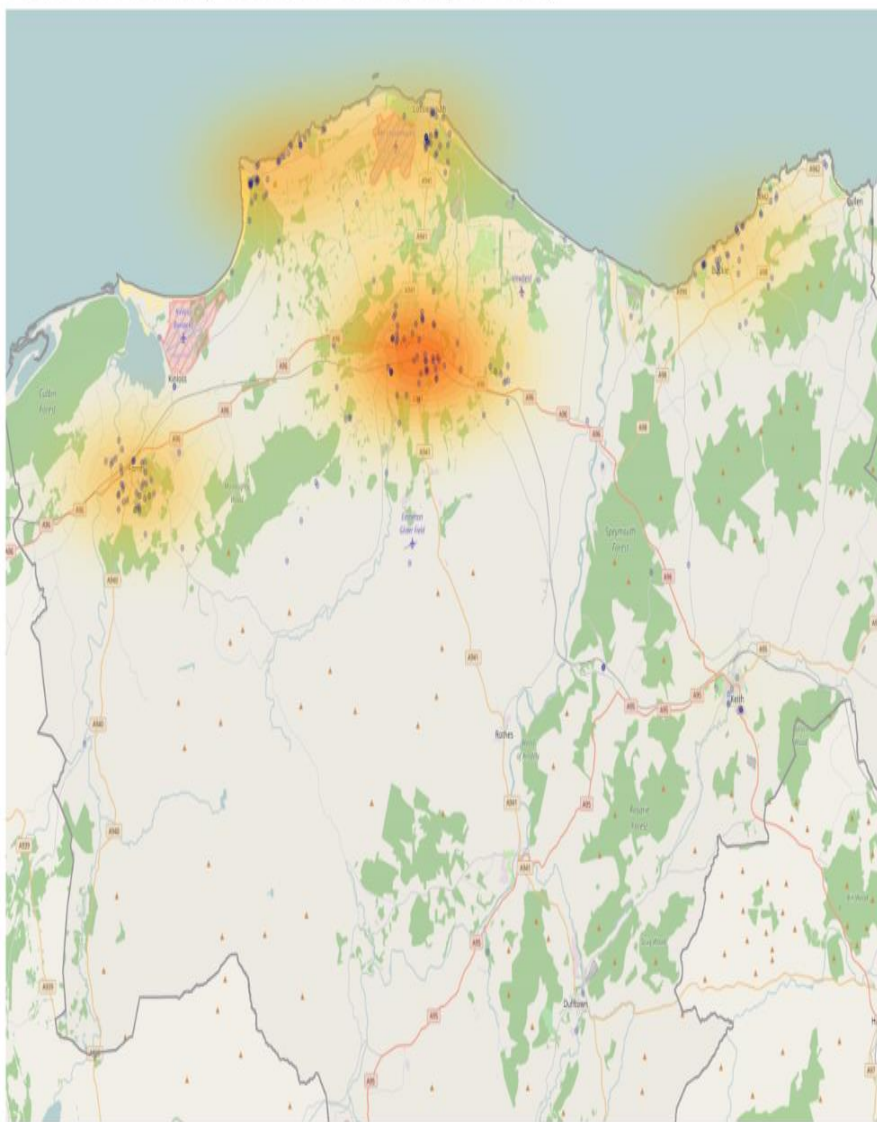
Key Information:

- 69% of all Fire Casualties resulted from Accidental Dwelling Fires
- Both of the Fatalities that occurred were as a result of Accidental Dwelling Fires.
- Partnership Working is Key to Reducing Casualties and Fatalities



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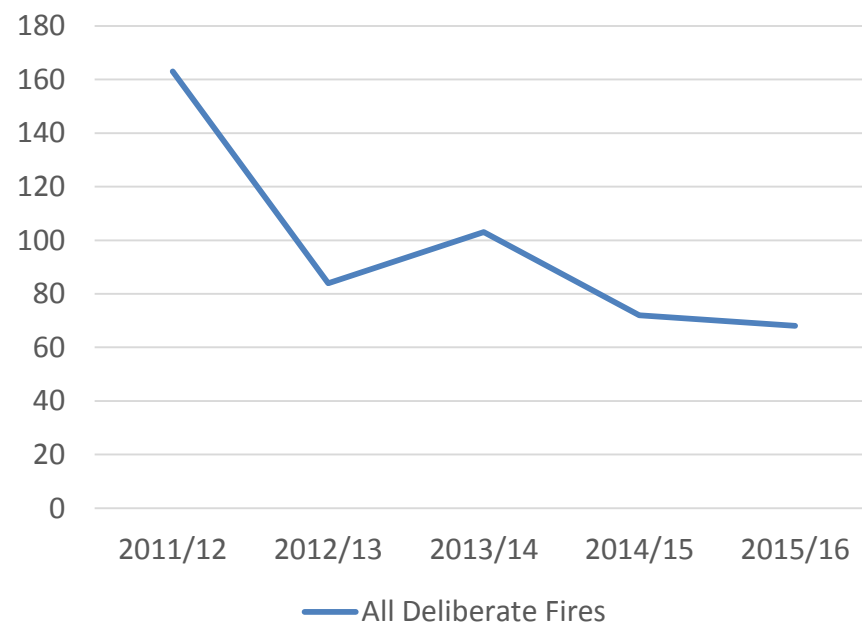


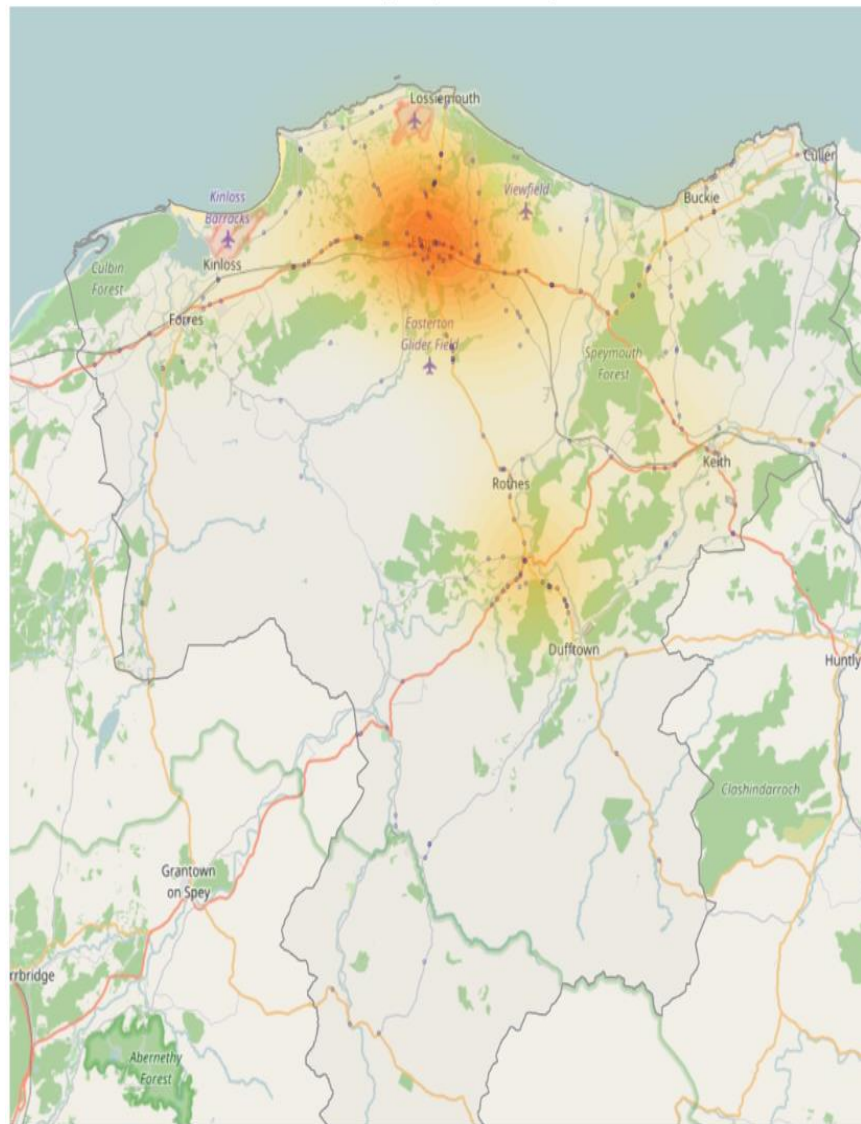
Priority – Reduction of Deliberate Fires

Key Information:

- Deliberate Fires (10%) of Total Activity
- Secondary Fires (77%) of All Deliberate Fires
- Average of 6 Deliberate Secondary Fires Per Month

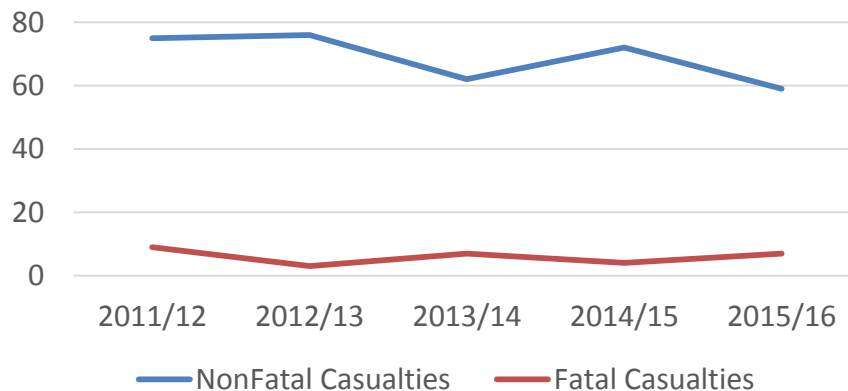
All Deliberate Fires





Priority – Reduction in Special Service Casualties

Special Service Casualties



Key Information:

- The highest percentage of Non-Fatal Casualties are from RTC's
- The highest percentage of Fatal Casualties result from incidents where we are assisting other Services.

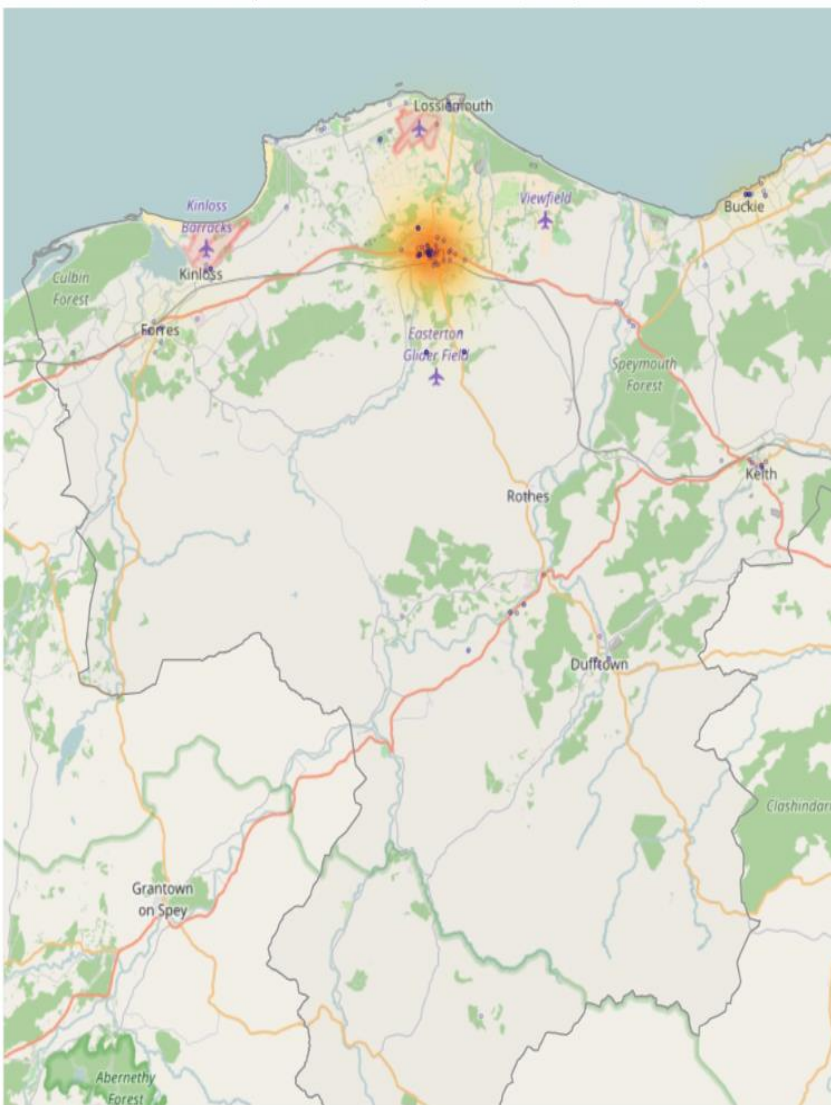


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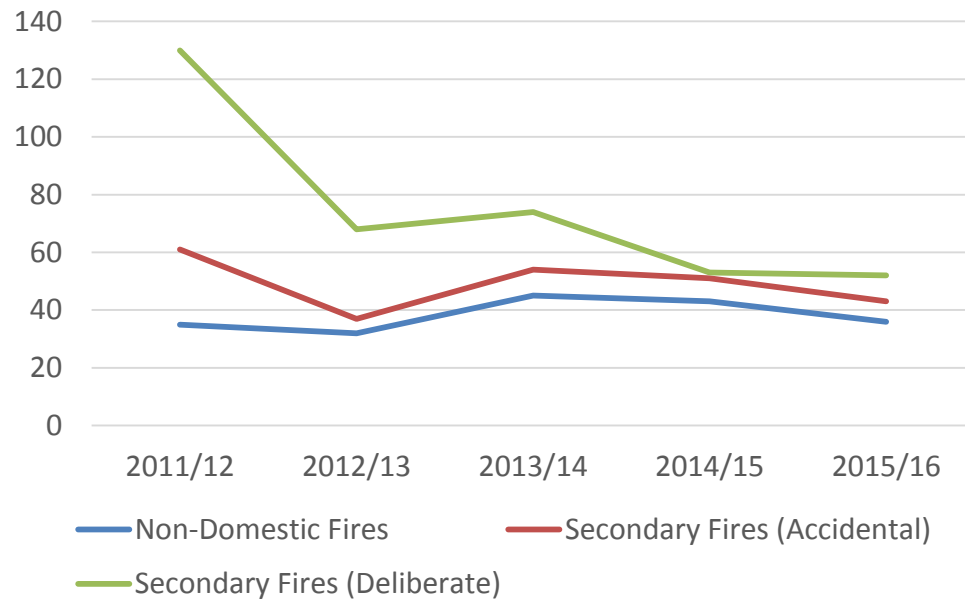
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Non-Domestic Fires (exc sheds etc) Density Map for Moray

Key Information:

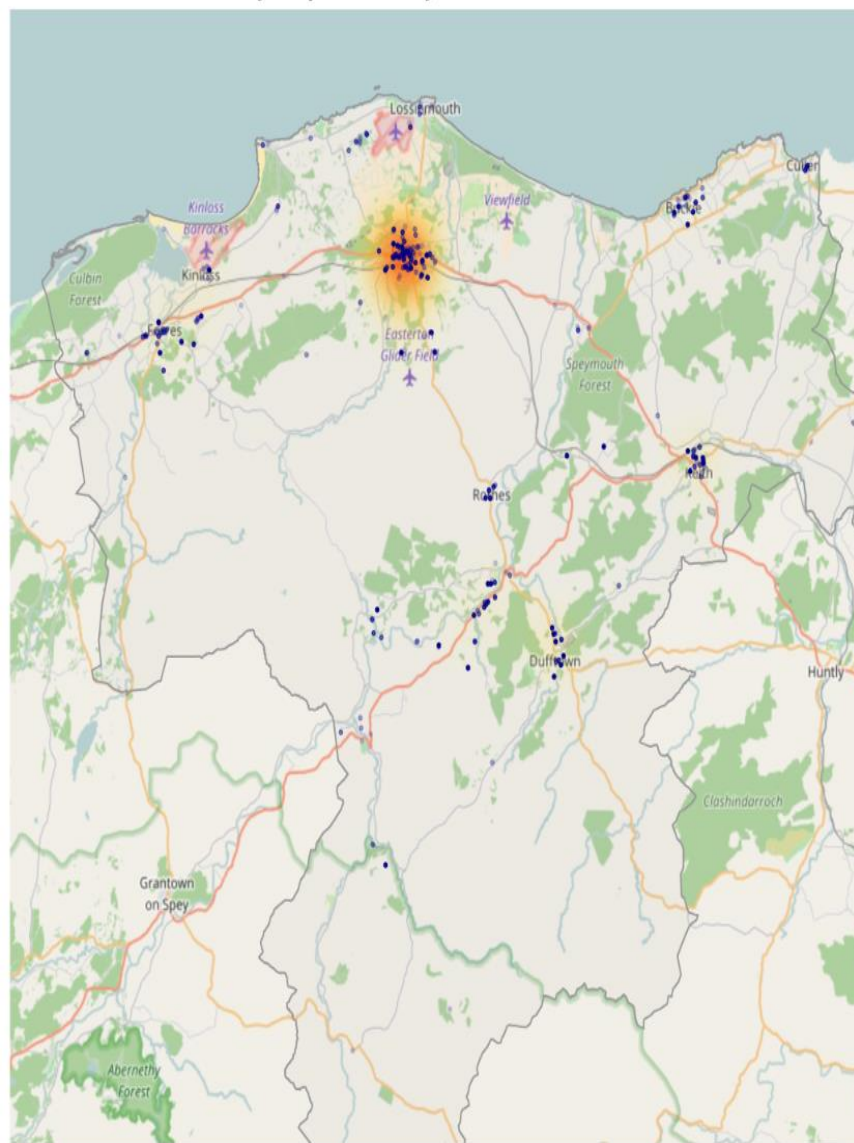
- The largest number of incidents from this priority are Deliberate Secondary Fires
- The number of Non-Domestic Fires has remained relatively static over the five year period.



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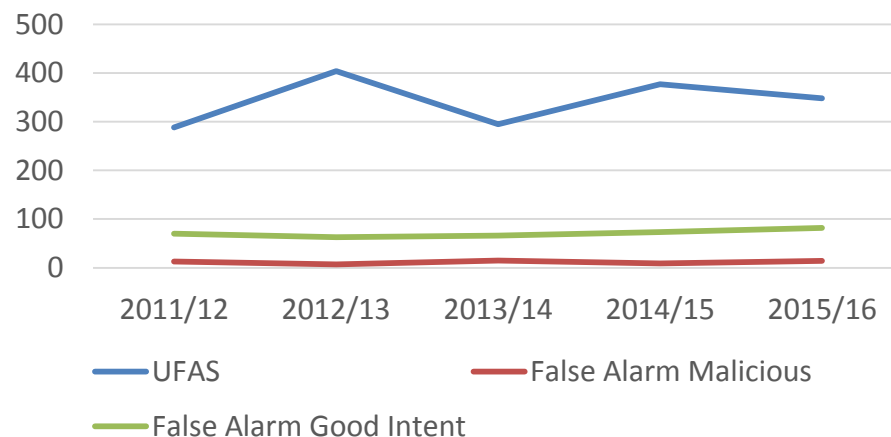
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Priority – Reduction of Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals

Key Information:

- 55% of All Activity Due to False Alarms
- Clear commitment from SFRS to work with Occupiers to Reduce UFAS Incidents
- Risk based approach used to determine response to premises.

- Training and Maintenance of Firefighter Skills
- Operational Intelligence
- Ongoing Recruitment of Retained Duty System Firefighters
- Civil Contingencies Planning and Preparations
- Future of the SFRS role
